Session 1

H1 – H4 were in action first and were looking to get us off to a good start with four games against Bedfordshire. Session 7

The penultimate session of the day. H5 & H6 complete the set of matches against Essex and H1 & H2 finish their day with matches against Suffolk. If we were to have any chance going into the final session we would need to win at least one of the matches against Suffolk. H5 & H6 would also need to pick up points in their matches with Essex. H5 controlled their match from start to finish and gained a 12-3 win. H6 also looked in control and took a 7-2 lead into the final end, a poor last end had them in trouble but Essex were only able to pick up four shots and we just managed to hold on for a vital 7-6 win. Meanwhile at the same time Suffolk were involved with two tight matches against Norfolk, they only managed to secure one win and the lead was now down to three points. The two games with Suffolk in this session were now vital and if we could manage to win them both we would take a one point lead into the final session. However, that never looked likely as H2 were completely out played and well beaten by their opponents 19-0. It was better news for H1 who always held a slight advantage and managed to secure a vital 8-4 win. A good session for us, picking up six points and meaning we trailed Suffolk by three points. Three wins from the final session would be enough to take a first ever county title for Hertfordshire.

Session 8

H4 picked up a crucial five shot count on the 8th end and managed to defend that lead on the last to win their game 9-5. Going into the final end H5 led 6-5 and just needed to win the end. H3 had a little more work to do as they trailed 10-8 and would need three shots on the final end. Unfortunately, H5 were unable to win their final end and the match finished in a 7-7 draw. That result meant that the title was now gone. H3
